We would like to express our heartfelt gratitude to The Proud Aryan Faculty. We also thank our parents for entrusting their wards to us and believe that we would only do the best for them.




From the Editor's Pen




Billy Joel said-

क्या है भूमंडलीय ऊष्मीकरण की वजह?


ग्लोबल वार्मिंग के लिए सबसे ज्यादा जिम्मेदार तो मनुष्य और उसकी गतिविधिया ही है। मनुष्य वाहनों, हवाई जहाजों, बिजली बनाने वाले संयंत्रों उद्योगों इत्यादि का अंधाधुंध प्रयोग कर रहे हैं। जिससे होने वाले गैसीय उत्सर्जन की वजह से कार्बन डाईऑक्साइड की बढ़ोतरी हो रही है। जंगलों में बड़ी संख्या में हो रहा विनाश इसकी दूसरी वजह है। जंगल कार्बन डाईऑक्साइड की मात्रा को प्राकृतिक रूप से नियंत्रित करते हैं, लेकिन इनकी बेतहाशा कटाई से यह प्राकृतिक नियंत्रक भी हमारे हाथ से छूटता जा रहा है। इसकी एक अन्य वजह सीएफसी है जो रेफ्रिजरेटर्स, आग बुझाने वाले यन्त्रों इत्यादि में इस्तेमाल की जाती है। यह धरती के ऊपर बने एक प्राकृतिक आवरण ओजोन परत को नष्ट करने का काम करती है। विकसित हो या अविकसित देश, हर जगह बिजली की जरूरत बढ़ती जा रही है। बिजली के उत्पादन के लिए जीवाष्म ईंघन का इस्तेमाल बड़ी मात्रा में करना पड़ता है। जीवाष्म ईंघन के जलने पर कार्बन डाइऑक्साइड पैदा होती है जो ग्रीनहाउस गैसों के प्रभाव को बढ़ा देती है। इसका नतीजा ग्लोबल वार्मिंग के रूप में सामने आता है।

ग्लोबल वार्मिंग से कैसे बचे?

- सभी देश क्योटो संधि का पालन करें। इसके तहत 2020 तक हानिकारक गैसों के उत्सर्जन (धुएँ) को कम करना होगा।

- जंगलों की कटाई को रोकना होगा। हम सभी अधिक से अधिक पेड़ लगाए। इससे भी ग्लोबल वार्मिंग के असर को कम किया जा सकता है।






















Achievements in Sports


